Spring Break Space Adventures is for children ages **7 to 11 years**.

Daily and weekly activities include a variety of hands-on, immersive activities and experiences based on space science, technology, engineering, art and math (STEAM). During **Spring Break Space Adventures**, participants may be required to stand; walk; sit; use hands and fingers to complete activities and to handle or feel objects, tools or controls; reach with hands and arms; climb stairs; balance; hear instructions; talk to communicate with others; utilize near-distance, far-distance and peripheral vision and depth perception; taste; and/or smell.

Session Descriptions for All Ages:

Spring Break in Space T.E.R.M.S.

This spring break, Space Foundation Discovery Center will be the Center of Discovery as we spend a week exploring in space "T.E.R.M.S." – adventurers will spend a day each exploring Technology, Engineering, Rockets/Robots, Mars, and Space Exploration for a spring break full of wonder and engagement. Spending Spring Break exploring in space "T.E.R.M.S." means our adventurers will spend a day each exploring activities, experiments, and demonstrations in:

- **A Day of Technology:** Coding, 3D printing, weather, and Earth science technologies
- **A Day of Engineering:** Learn the Engineering process, design and build a spacecraft, fly your spacecraft, rescue your craft from a crash landing, and more...
- **A Day of Rockets & Robots:** Build and launch different style rockets, program and compete with multiple robots
- **A Day of Mars:** Explore the red planet just like NASA through satellites, rovers, landers, helicopters, and more...
- **A Day of Space Exploration:** Discover the wonders of space: from our own Sun to the planets, dwarf planets, and the Kuiper Belt all the way out to exoplanets and galaxies

Dress Code

Spring Break Space Adventures participants will be given a **Spring Break Space Adventures** t-shirt. Any other clothing should not have inappropriate language or images. Participants must wear tennis shoes or other sturdy shoes which encase the entire foot.

Shirt, shoes, pants/shorts are REQUIRED.

Lunch and Snacks

Parents must provide child attending the **Spring Break Space Adventures**, a 1) non-perishable lunch, 2) morning and 3) afternoon snacks and a bottled water each day. Water bottles may be refilled in the Discovery Center. Please mark all containers clearly, with full names. **Please note:** no outside beverages allowed except during allotted lunch and snack times.

In case of sensitive allergies: Please remind your child to not share their lunch or snack items with others.

Restroom Procedures

All participants will be escorted to and from the restrooms, and the restrooms will be checked regularly for safety and security purposes.

Medications

A child may self-administer medication only if his/her parent has provided the Space Foundation with a completed and signed "Permission and Waiver to Self-Administer Medication" form. The form is required and can be found on page 4 of this Program Guide. **Please fill out one form per child, forms that list multiple children or are missing information will not be accepted.**

Check In/Out

Spring Break Space Adventures DOES NOT allow for early drop off or late pick up due to staffing.

Enter Camps through Main Discovery Center doors, enter gallery, Camp Table will be near Science on a Sphere™

Check-in: Come in with child and sign/date each morning at camp desk by entry of Science on a Sphere™ in gallery

Check out: Come in, **ID required**, and sign/date each evening at camp desk in classroom at end of blue lighted hallway

Only the parent, or those listed as the Emergency Contact may pick up a child (must be 18 years or older). If a parent desires that their child leave with someone who is not specified on the emergency form, the parent must supply written permission. Please keep the Emergency Contact/Pick-Up Authorization updated so that the **Spring Break Space Adventures** staff can immediately reach the appropriate person(s).

Sessions dismissed promptly at 4:00p.m. (*Early pick-up is allowed, please be sure to sign child out of camp for the day*)

If a child is not picked up on time:

- 1) The parents will be called at the home, work, and cell numbers provided. If the parent cannot get to the Space Foundation within a reasonable length of time, the staff and parent will discuss who will come to pick up the child.
- 2) If no contact is made with a parent, staff will start to call the emergency contacts immediately to pick up the child.
- 3) If the parents and the emergency contacts cannot be reached, the Space Foundation Child Safety Lead will be called.
- 4) If all of the above steps have been exhausted and approximately one hour or more has passed, the staff will then call the local law enforcement for assistance in locating the parents.

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Injuries, Illnesses and Accidents

Parents will be notified in the event of an emergency, injury, or sickness requiring medical attention. Several Space Foundation staff in the building are Adult and Pediatric First Aid, CPR, AED certified. If your child becomes sick or injured, you or your designated emergency contact person will be notified at once. If, in the opinion of the staff, your child appears to be feverish or contagious as to warrant concern, your child will be isolated. You or your designated emergency person will be asked to pick up your child immediately. In case of life-or-limb threatening situation, emergency services will be called. In case a parent needs to notify us of an emergency occurring while child is in attendance, please contact our main desk at 719.576.8000 or 800.691.4000.

Emergency Procedures

As required by the Department of Human Services both Fire and Tornado drills may be conducted and recorded on a regular basis. All staff members are familiar with the location of the fire extinguishers, smoke detectors, pull stations and emergency exits throughout the facility. In the event of a fire emergency, the priority of the staff members is to ensure the safe exit of all program participants. In the event of a tornado all staff members and participants must sit on the floor against an interior wall away from any windows. Caution will be taken concerning overhead hazards that might fall from the ceiling. Staff members will make every effort to keep the participants safe and calm until they receive an all clear.

Discipline

Our staff members consider it their responsibility to curtail inappropriate behaviors and problems at any time. Adequate supervision is provided to redirect participants and provide suggestions before a problem occurs.

Appropriate social behavior is required for all programs and facility use. Participants are encouraged to act in a way that will not hurt another person physically, mentally or emotionally. A participant may be asked to withdraw from a class or program and/or leave the facility, with parent or emergency contact, if behavior does not comply with the Museum Rules and Regulations. There will be no reimbursement if a child is removed for disciplinary problems.

Reporting of Child Abuse and Neglect

Colorado State Law requires that all caregivers observing child abuse or neglect, or conditions which may result in abuse or neglect, must immediately report suspicions to the Department of Human Services. In the event that a staff member observes abuse, neglect or conditions that would result in wrongdoing to the child, the staff member is required by law to report this observation to the Space Foundation Child Safety Lead. If the observation appears to be valid, the Space Foundation Child Safety Lead will report the observation to the Department of Human Services and/or the local law enforcement agency.

In all cases, medications can only be changed or modified by completing another Permission and Waiver to Self-Administer Medication Form. I understand that if it is necessary for my child to take medication, during the **Spring Break Space Adventures** program, I recognize and acknowledge that there are certain risks of physical injury in connection with the self-administration by my child. Such risks include, but are not limited to, failing to properly administer the medication, failing to observe side effects, failing to assess and/or recognize an adverse reaction, failing to assess and/or recognize a medical emergency, and failing to recognize the need to summon emergency medical services. In consideration of the Space Foundation allowing my child to self-administer medication, I do hereby fully release or discharge the Space Foundation and its employees from any and all claims from injuries, damages, and losses I or my child may have (or accrue to me and my child), arising out of, or in any way associated with the self-administered medication.
